

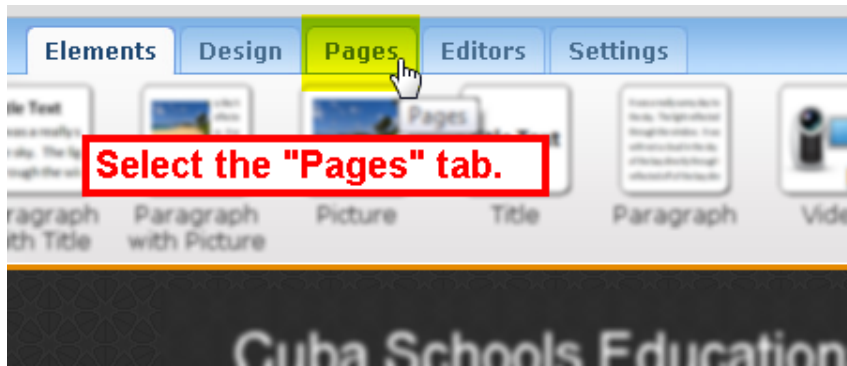


A blog is a great tool for an educational website in a much different sense than most people know blogs. The basic advantages to a blog include easy access to daily updating and posting small snippets of information, as well as the ability to search for articles in sequential archives. 
Add a Blog



Manage Pages



A blog is essentially just a page on your site that is not static. It changes typically every day. Blogs are set up to manage frequent posts, whereas a regular webpage is more static and offers consistent information, multimedia, and links.




Manage your Blog
